TARGET FOR RENEWABLES

Business needs policy certainty to ensure it can adapt to a clean energy world.

<p>23.5% renewable energy by 2020. No target beyond that Construct Snowy Hydro 2.0</p>	<p>50% renewable by 2030, for 70,000 clean energy jobs.</p>	<p>100% renewable energy by 2030. Set Energy Storage Target.</p>

TARGET FOR EMISSIONS

All countries need to surpass their Paris commitment to keep warming below 1.5C.

<p>26% - 28% below 2005 levels by 2030.</p>	<p>45% on 2005 levels by 2030, and net zero pollution by 2050.</p>	<p>63% - 82% reduction by 2030, and net zero emissions by 2040.</p>

STRATEGIES TO REDUCE AUSTRALIA'S CARBON EMISSIONS

Australia's emissions have been rising since 2013.

<p>A \$2 billion Climate Solutions Fund. to help farmers, etc reduce emissions</p>	<p>Extend the Safeguard Mechanism on big polluters</p>	<p>A price on carbon to make heavy industry and energy companies pay for excess emissions</p>

TRANSPORT

Transport is the second highest source of emissions (20%), and growing fast.

<p>Develop a National Electric Vehicle Strategy</p>	<p>EVs to be 50% of new car sales by 2030. Set emissions standards. \$200m for 200 fast charging stations</p>	<p>EVs to be 100% of new vehicle sales by 2030. \$150m for fast charging infrastructure.</p>
